The first quarter has flown by and we are well into the completion of the second quarter. As we move forward, it is helpful to look back and see some of the things that you might have missed. The FCCLA and the Elementary Student Council hosted a food drive for the Bread Box and the results were incredible! Over 2300 pounds and 1100+ items donated to help those in our community. It isn't enough to simply say thank you for your generosity and giving.

The government class participated in the Clay County Government Day on October 31st. The students were able to tour and learn about the different offices in and around the courthouse, understanding the responsibilities of each office. The students were treated to a meal by the Legion Auxiliary members and later in the afternoon had a presentation on human trafficking by the Nebraska Attorney General's Office. Finally, the day wrapped up with the students of SPS presenting a mock trial to allow all participants to witness how those proceedings work. Finally, thank you to everyone able to attend the Veteran's Day program on November 11th. Thank you to all veterans for your service to our country. But as we take time to look back, it is also important to look forward as well.

One of the biggest activities taking place in the next month will be semester tests. The 7th -12th grade students have semester exams scheduled for December 19th and 20th. Those days are a 2:00 dismissal for all students and we want to help make sure our students do their best. As you start thinking about what preparations need to be taking place for semester tests, it can be helpful to have students start to review early in order to try and reduce as much stress as possible. As parents, you can help too. Help them with their organization so they know when they have time to study, and even what to study. If need be, build a schedule for them so they aren't trying to multi-task and review multiple subjects at a time. Encourage them to review their notes, and review them frequently. Finally, as the days of the tests approach, having a good sleep schedule and breakfast in the morning has been helpful for the success of students. These small tasks

**Schedule Changes & Enrolling in Dual Credit Classes**

As the semester is quickly coming to a close, it is time to think about schedule changes for the second semester. If your child is wanting to make an adjustment to his/her schedule, please visit Mrs. Noel, school counselor, for a Schedule Change form. Adjustments to schedules need to be completed before Christmas break.

Students taking dual credit classes need to have their registration forms submitted to Mrs. Noel by early December. The students taking English Composition II need to have their forms turned in by November 10. Early registration will provide students with a better chance of being admitted into the college course they want.

**MTSS**

School improvement is another area we are always working on. The MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support) team this past year has been working on providing a more efficient and effective way to identify all of our kids and their needs, low to high. We wanted to be able to provide intervention resources for teachers that would be helpful and not just another thing to do. After putting a ton of effort and energy into creating this new process our MTSS team was honored by being asked to present at the NeMTSS Summit Conference held at the Younes Center in Kearney back in October. Myself, along with Kristi Ladehoff, Michelle Kreutzer, Taylor Roth, and Robin Griess presented our process to a group of schools around the state which was met with much adulation. A few schools as well as representatives from the Nebraska Department of Education have since reached out asking me for additional resources to share, or to pass along thank you's for applicable resources they can actually use in their schools. I can speak for the group when I say there was a great sense of validation for all the hard work we had put in. However, all the credit goes to these four ladies. They drove all the work, I just helped them along the way. Probably one of my proudest moments as a principal!

**Instructional Rounds**

Last year and again this year we have had the privilege of having an Instructional Coach, LaRaesha Kugel, come from ESU 9. She helps us with a variety of things when it comes to instructional strategies, MTSS, and other areas teachers want help refining or getting better in. Instructional Rounds are something that we have done in the past at Sutton, but since COVID we really haven't had an opportunity to get back into it. The instructional round process is a structured way for schools and teachers to diagnose learning needs for students and educators, focus on and improve learning tasks, develop a shared vision of high-quality teaching and learning, and foster a collaborative culture that supports learning. These observations are not meant to correct other teachers or to even necessarily leave them feedback. The purpose of these are for teachers to learn new strategies they feel are worthy to try out themselves. Every

school has great things happening that are observation worthy. Being able to use this observation strategy not only helps show off the amazing things that are happening in our school, it also helps us collaborate at a deeper level. We started Instructional Rounds in November with teachers observing other teachers at Sutton. Our goal is to collaborate with other schools so that we can show off the great things we are doing and also see what other schools are doing that may help us get better. In education sharing is caring and ultimately it comes back to what practices and strategies are best for kids.

**Bullying and the Power of Words**

I wanted to take a minute and share with you some things that we have been working on. The specific topic above was presented to 5th and 6th graders. Bullying seems to be a constant problem and one of those areas that tends to be difficult to get a handle on. Because we are not immune to bullying and the power of words in Sutton schools, our guidance counselor, Monica Noel, and Jeri George, our school mental practitioner, held a presentation with these students back in October. The kids were engaged and had a lot of great things to share.

After the presentation, we wanted to give the kids an opportunity to ask questions or share what they learned in a non threatening or embarrassing way. We had them go back to their home rooms and write down anything that they had questions about, feelings they had, what they learned, etc.. This would give us some feedback and provide us an opportunity to go back and answer and address problems or questions they had without alienating anyone.

The teachers, Mrs. Noel, Jeri, and myself looked through all of the responses and we received some excellent feedback and questions. Jeri and myself went back into the classrooms and addressed a few of the questions and concerns the kids had, one of them being the topic of suicide. We acknowledged the fact that sometimes people feel like this, but most importantly that we are here to support them no matter what! I want to be as transparent as possible and work with parents and as strange as this sounds, I am extremely grateful because this presentation was able to bring to light some feelings that may have not been

shared otherwise. If there is ever a need to talk with someone or get immediate support please call the national suicide hotline at 988. Again, Continuing education on social and emotional health is an ongoing thing in all of our grades. Mrs. Noel covers a multitude of topics every week within our Second Step curriculum. Attacking these topics is hard but the safety and security of OUR KIDS is priority number one and always will be at Sutton.

**PTO Events**

Finally, there have been a few different events that the PTO has put on this year. In September they held a movie night in the elementary school gym. For their first event, it was a pretty good turnout with close to a hundred people showing up to watch *Minions: The Rise of Gru*. Popcorn and water were provided and people brought in blankets, pillows, lawn chairs and enjoyed the show.

In November the Edgerton Center came out and put on a variety of different activities in the elementary gym. These activities were for all ages and geared towards science. They were all hands-on activities. They also put on some demonstrations in the theater that showcased the power of electricity. The kids enjoyed themselves and it was another positive experience for all. More events are coming up in the second semester so look for those events coming up. It's great to be able to host these events for our families and students. The PTO is always looking for new ideas and welcomes you to come to the meetings, which are held the second Thursday of each month in the elementary library at 7:00pm or check them out on Facebook at Sutton PTO to get more information. 



