Looking Ahead to Next Year

It's that time of year when discussions ensue regarding the 23-24 school year. Recently, the Board of Education approved the 23-24 school calendar. School will start in August on Wednesday, August 16th. The first semester will end on the 19th of December, with students returning on January 3rd. Again, the first two Friday's in March will provide staff and students with a break from the books. Included are four in-service days to allow for staff members to address our school improvement goals with professional development. Staff members learning and improving to better educate our students. Parent-Teacher Conferences are September 25th and 28th, which is a proactive approach to addressing student performance before the end of the first quarter, October 13th. The last day of school for students is May 16th.

This time of the year, information is gathered from staff through a requisition process. Requisitioning equipment, furniture, technology, textbooks, supplies,

etc. this time of year allows a Superintendent to begin work on the 23-24 Budget. These requests are added to staff salaries for 23-24 and building and facility project amounts (strategic plan). The new school budget year begins in September. It's always exciting to anticipate the changes for the next school year!

As a district, we spent the 2022-23 school year focusing on our district strategic plan and continual school improvement process. The processes have allowed community members, parents, the board of education, staff and students to share perceived strengths and areas to improve on as a district. District and student data is included in the action plans of improvement. We appreciate the rich conversations with stakeholders and plan to share the outcomes from the Fall 2022 community engagement meetings soon. The processes allows the district to meet the needs of our students/community and progress toward the shared vision. We believe these processes keep our district moving forward.

A Note From Mr. Vance

Sutton Students are going to be working very hard during April to complete their NSCAS statewide assessments. Students in grades 3-8 participate in the NSCAS Assessments in the areas of English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. Students in grades 5 and 8 also participated in an NSCAS Science assessment. The NSCAS assessments are adaptive tests, meaning that the test adjusts the difficulty level based on how a student answers the previous question.

On March 21st, the junior class participated with other students across the state in their NSCAS state assessment by taking the ACT test. Students participated in exams on English, Math, Reading, Science, and Writing, just as they would if they had taken the exam on one of the other Saturday National ACT assessment dates. Student scores can be shared with various colleges and universities to help them in their admission to those institutions. To help them prepare for the NSCAS ACT next year, the sophomore class participated in the PreACT on March 15th. This gives them an opportunity to experience what the actual ACT test is like.

We are proud of the effort that the staff have done in preparing our students and to our students for their hard work on all assessments.

Outside of the NSCAS Assessments, we are proud of our students who have qualified for state in a variety of activities. Korey Poppe qualified for state in wrestling after he placed 3rd in districts. Lindsey Ladehoff placed 3rd in Informative speaking and the team of Carson Mau, Devon Griesss, Owen Schelkopf, Weston Ohrt and Aidan Jones placed 2nd in Oral Interpretation of Drama at district speech. They competed at the state meet in Mid-March. Sonia Castaneda and Madison White received a GOLD at the FCCLA STAR events and advance to State. Congratulations to all students on their success at district events and for representing Sutton Public Schools at their respective state events.

Finally, as we approach the end of the school year, the excitement turns towards graduation. The senior class and their parents should have received a letter detailing the expectations for graduation. The letter detailed seating and flower information as well. If you or your senior did NOT receive this information, please contact the office so we can get that to you.

Baccalaureate will take place on May 7th at Sutton Public Schools in the theater. This will begin at 7:00 pm. Members of the senior class have been working on their class video and will share it that evening. If your student has not submitted photos for the video, please be sure to do that as soon as possible.

The last day for seniors is currently scheduled for Tuesday, May 9th. Rehearsal for seniors for graduation will take place on Friday, May 12th and it will begin at 8:30 am. All seniors are **required** to attend rehearsal.

On May 13th at 4:00 pm, Sutton Public Schools will be hosting its commencement activities to honor the seniors of the Class of 2023. Please join us at Graduation as we celebrate the success of this year's senior class and congratulate them on this accomplishment.

Step Up Day and Class Lists

This is the time of year that our staff begins to think about student placement for the 2023-2024 school year. The staff approaches this in a very thoughtful manner. Grade level teachers will meet and discuss student and teacher pairings. During these meetings, staff take into consideration a variety of factors when dividing students into classes. Staff consider boy/girl ratio, achievement levels and peer relationships. Teachers are with your students day in and day out. They know which students will work well with which teacher and which peers work well together or clash. All of those discussions are had collectively as they are placed into specific classrooms. I will then meet with each grade level to discuss, make changes, and finalize those placements. This happens at the end of April.

We will continue to have our annual Step Up Day, as we feel that that is a great tradition that we want to continue. However, instead of splitting up students to go to one specific classroom, as an example, all 2nd graders will go to a 3rd grade room where they will meet both 3rd grade teachers and so on. We feel this will be a much better situation if we have teachers who will not be returning the following year. This will also help if we have incoming or outgoing students over the summer. It will allow us some flexibility to move students around, if needed. Last day packets will be sent home as usual, but our plan with class lists is to mail them home over the summer, sometime in July, but we haven't set a date yet. Open house night becomes an even bigger event for you to come to and meet your teacher on August 14, 2023. Parents and students will get the chance to meet their teacher, and have them answer any questions you may have for them.

Finally, we are asking that parents no longer make requests for specific teachers for a number of reasons. We understand that you may have a close or special relationship with a teacher, however this may put other staff members in a very precarious position. Again, our staff puts forth a great deal of effort to make sure each child is set up to be successful. We want to encourage parents to talk with their child's current teacher about what may be best for them going forward, but refrain from asking them to be placed in specific classrooms. We will take everything into consideration, but do not want to get into the habit of making promises we cannot keep.

Grade Level Sections and New Assignments

It seems like every year we have new staff members to introduce and next year will be no different. We still have some moving parts as we move into next year and a few unknowns, but let's start with who will be here and their positions. First we have two new Special Education teachers joining us next year. Makyah Wagoner, who is a former graduate of Sutton will be joining our team on the elementary side. She previously taught at Sandy Creek and was split between teaching 3rd grade and Special

Education. Our other new addition in SPED is Megan Knuth, who also graduated from Sutton. She will be on the high school end and previously taught at Grand Island Northwest in their SPED department. We are truly blessed to have two former graduates coming back to teach at their alma mater. Growing and keeping our own has become even more important with the ever changing landscape of education. Megan and Makyah will bring a wealth of knowledge and passion to our school district for many years to come and we welcome them back.

With the addition of hiring an additional teacher last year we were able to have two sections of every grade level except one. Next year that single section will be sixth grade. Mr. Newmyer will be our only sixth grade teacher and Mr. Gerber will move down to fifth grade alongside Mrs. Ladehoff. Mr. Newmyer will also stay in his current room down in the high school and both grades will departmentalize Science, Math, and Social Studies with Mr. Newmyer, Mr. Gerber, and Mrs. Ladehoff being responsible for each one respectively.

English Language Arts Curriculum

Last school year we went through Math curriculum review/adoption. After that process we decided to adopt and implement a new curriculum for the 2022-2023 school year. Next year we will be reviewing and possibly adopting a new curriculum in the area of Language Arts. This will be a PreK-12 review/adoption process. Much like we did with the math curriculum I will give stakeholders updates of what the Language Arts curriculum team has been doing and the next steps in the process as we move throughout the school year. Just because a curriculum area is up for review does not mean that an entirely new curriculum will be adopted. It could simply mean that after careful review the next steps are to simply update the current curriculum to its newest version. What I do know at this point is that our team will consist of elementary staff and Jr/Sr high staff. We will be seeking assistance from the ESU 9, as we did last time, to help guide us through this process. As a district we want a curriculum that addresses areas of need, that is rigorous, and that meets state standards. In a nutshell, we want what is best for our students and fits our standards of learning so that it pushes us forward as a school district. I'll have more details for you in the August newsletter.

Military ATV

On February 15, military personnel SFC Kyle Schram, SFC Shawna Schram, SSG Caleb Geiger, and SPC Thomas stopped by Sutton Public Schools and let students and staff check out and play around with the deactivated M-ATV. Students learned fun facts like how much the vehicle weighs, the purpose of the vehicle, and how it operates.



ACTIONS Day

On March 15, nearly 30 students attended the 2023 ACTIONS Day held at Central Community College. These students were chosen by teachers to compete in multiple academic categories ranging from Algebra I to Sports and Capital Cities.

Educators Rising

As a way to help combat the teacher shortage both in the state and nation, Sutton High School is partnering with ESU 6 and ESU 9 to pilot the "Grow Your Own" initiative. Students interested in the Education Pathway will have the opportunity to take dual credit courses beginning in their junior year, complete practicums, and participate in a newly created Educators Rising chapter starting in the fall of 2023.

April 17-21



Kearney, NE - The Sutton Chapter joined over 370 other Nebraska FCCLA members and advisers at the State Peer Education Conference held in Kearney, NE on February 27, 2023. The theme of the meeting was “Channeling Your Inner Leader.” The State Peer Officer Team encouraged chapters to focus their leadership efforts at a local level through their Community Outreach Project.

The keynote speaker at the conference was Monica Huber, a training specialist. Her presentation was titled “*How Do I Prepare to Show Up for My...self... school...work...family...friends... life and everything in between?*” She shared a message about being prepared for everything in life, with leadership and schoolwork examples.

Additionally, three breakout sessions that represented the three FCCLA National Programs the State Peer Officer Teams are promoting this year: Families Acting for Community Traffic Safety (FACTS), Career Connection, and Stand Up. The FACTS session was presented by members of the Community Leader Team and featured the Nebraska State Patrol. Trooper Shriver and Trooper Kroeger provided a rollover demonstration for members and advisers. The Career Leader Team hosted a Career Panel with Carol Erwin (post-secondary teacher educator), Hannah Kizer (interior designer), Kris Walahoski (registered dietician), and Tyler Clay (Buckle recruiter). Each of their careers represented a different section of the FCS Career Pathways. These representatives answered questions from members about their own careers and how they got to where they are today. The Family Leader Team partnered with Jackie Freeman presenting “A Healthy Outside Starts from the Inside.” Jackie shared her story as a past FCCLA member and also keeping her life balanced with being a mom, running coach, and school nurse. Her main point included how to balance physical health with mental health to keep our “insides” as healthy as our “outsides.” She expressed that all members have a special place in this life and that we will achieve great things now and in the future.

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
