ANNUAL REPORT TO PATRONS

This annual report has two purposes, (1) to keep the patrons informed about the school system and (2) to meet the requirements of Rule 10 established by the Nebraska Department of Education. This report is for your information and if you have questions, feel free to contact the Superintendent.

General Information

Sutton Public Schools is a Class III school that is accredited by the Nebraska Department of Education. The school is a member of the Southern Nebraska Conference that includes: Centennial, David City, Fairbury, Fillmore Central, Thayer Central, Heartland, Milford, Sandy Creek, Superior, Sutton, and Wilber-Clatonia.

The District is governed by a six-member Board of Education. Each member is selected for a four year term. Board members must be residents of School District #2 and each member serves the district with no compensation for their services. The Board

of Education holds a regular meeting on the third Monday of each month. Board meetings are normally held in the board room, which is located in the Superintendent's office. All board meetings are open to the public and are advertised according to state open meeting laws. Public notice of meetings is placed in the <u>Clay County News</u>. Current board members are: James A. Jones, Jr.-president, Jerry Overturf-vice president, Teryl Andersen-secretary, and members Jolene Griess, Brent Mau and Michael Zoucha.

During the 2022-2023 school year the average daily membership for grades Pre K-12 was 395.97 students.

Graduate Information

There were 30 graduates in 2023, which is a 97% graduation rate for the class. Of the class, 14 are attending a 4 year post-secondary school; 9 are attending 2 year post-secondary school; 2 joined the Military and 4 joined the workforce. Test Information 2022-2023 School Year

During the 2022-2023 school year the Average Daily Membership (ADM) was 395.97 and the Annual Cost Per Pupil for the ADM was \$17,631. (This does not include BEES program)

Staffing

Sutton Public Schools is served by three administrators, Dr. Dana Wiseman, Superintendent; Mr. Jason Cafferty, Secondary Principal; and Mr. Michael Shively, Elementary Principal. Dr. Wiseman is beginning her 21st year at Sutton (5 years as the Junior/Senior High Principal and 16 years as Superintendent). This is the 1st year at Sutton for Mr. Cafferty who has 12 years experience as a Elementary Principal and 1 as a High School Principal. This will be Mr. Shively's 4th year at Sutton as Elementary Principal. The superintendent's contract is for 12 months; the secondary principal and elementary principal are on a 10 ½ month contract. Principals are required to hold a Masters Degree with an endorsement as a school principal. The Superintendent has a Doctorial Degree.

In addition to the administrative staff, the school is served by 40 certificated teachers. Based on the 2023-2024 State of the Schools Report, 18 of the teachers hold a masters degree. Teachers are contracted for 185 days of service; one teacher has a

205 day contract, one has a 200 day contract, and one a 195 day contract. Teachers must hold a minimum of a Bachelors Degree with proper endorsements in their educational teaching field. Teachers at Sutton average 10.88 years teaching at Sutton and 14.68 years of total teaching experience.

The support staff consists of 24 full and part -time employees. Included are three secretaries, one bookkeeper, one registered nurse, 7 paraprofessional, five food-service personnel, four transportation personnel and three custodians.

The school contracts with Educational Service Unit #9 for diagnostic/evaluation services. Occupational and physical therapy is contracted through Central Nebraska Rehab. Sutton Public Schools provides services for Speech Language and Resource with Sutton school employees.
